

Tribal ID in South Dakota



As of **July 1, 2011**, South Dakota law requires that valid tribal IDs must be treated **EQUAL** to a South Dakota-issued state ID or Driver's License for identification purposes pertaining to banking, check cashing where checks may be cashed, and for age verification when purchasing tobacco products. However, tribal IDs are not required to be accepted as a valid form of identification for the purpose of writing checks, and businesses may still refuse to cash a check for other reasons (i.e. Check amount is too high).

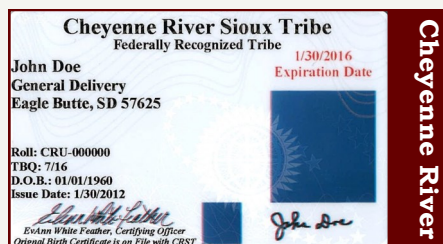

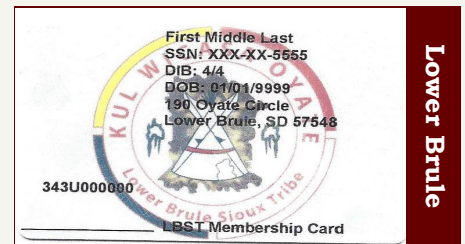
Cheyenne River



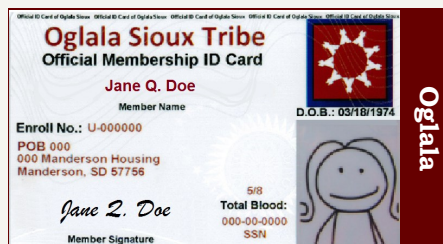
Crow Creek



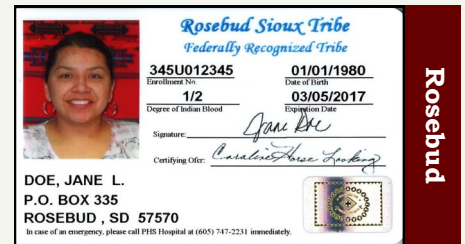

Lower Brule



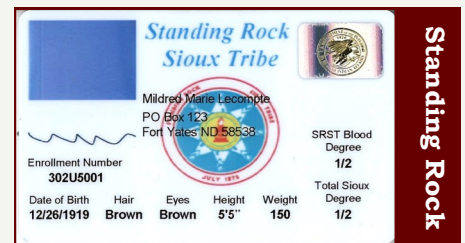

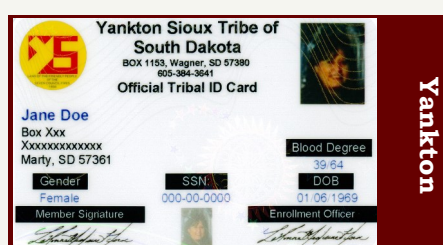
